## Urias' Life...

od, in His all-wise Providence, saw fit to call home URIAS BEEBE, beloved son, brother and favorite uncle, on September 7, 2020 to reunite with his parents and siblings.

A native of Cumberland County, Urias was born May 14, 1937, in Eastover, Cumberland County, North Carolina to Reverend Dr. Eddie Harris and Odessa Ree (McMillan) Beebe. Urias accepted Christ at a very early age at his home church, New Bethel A.M.E. Zion. He was a long time member and served as Assistant Class Member 12, prior to his death.

At an early age, Urias would follow his mother around as she played the piano for churches. He developed a passion for music and began playing the piano by ear, and the first song he played for his parents was Amazing Grace. After this rendition, he began taking lessons and by the age of 14, Urias was playing well enough to play for Sunday school and church services.

Inspired by his parents, Urias graduated from Anne Chestnut School, Class of 1955 and graduated from North Carolina A&T University, Class of 1958 with a Tailoring degree. Shortly after graduating from A&T University, Urias moved to Philadelphia.

URIAS worked with the Department of Defense (DOD) as a top secret clearance telecommunications specialist, located in Philadelphia. While in Philadelphia, Urias was an entrepreneur. He became a Tailor with a local seamstress in his spare time. He continued to play the organ/piano for several surrounding churches in the Philadelphia area. Urias also owned a luncheonette restaurant, where he demonstrated his gourmet cooking skills near the university. He was known for bringing gourmet food samples to the office for his fellow colleagues to try new dishes.

URIAS transferred to Pope Air Force Base and shortly after retired from civil service. Urias became a Substitute Teacher in the Cumberland County School District. Urias attended Shaw University Theological program where he developed a deeper relationship with Christ. He continued his passion for music, becoming an expert organist and played both the organ and piano for numerous local churches including New Bethel AME Zion Church, Friendship Missionary Baptist Church, Acts Missionary Baptist Church, College Heights Presbyterian

Church, St. Joseph Episcopal Church, St. Ann Catholic Church, Evans Metropolitan A.M.E. Zion Church and Victory Missionary Baptist Church. He volunteered at local senior citizens' centers and fulfilled his passion as the Director of the Fayetteville Senior Ensemble which focused on Negro Spirituals for special events in the community.

URIAS served on several boards including the Anne Chestnut Alumni Association and a member of the Silver Anne Chestnut Alumni Association (Senior Citizen Alumni group), where he served as Vice President. Urias was also a member of Seventy First Civic Improvement Association, where he was the Treasurer, and served on the voter director board.

URIAS was known as a gourmet cook, dog whisperer, and jokester. He loved to make people laugh. In September 1998, Urias was interviewed by the Fayetteville Observer Times for the article, 'A man to Admire,' that featured his father, a civic community leader in the Seventy First area. In the article, Urias was quoted "I wasn't a mean child, just mischievous. I was always into something. I used to get a beaten least twice a week. So one day, I told my mother that I was going to run away because it was getting too hot around here. I told her not to tell my dad. So the next morning at the breakfast table my father said, 'Son I hear you are going to run away.' I said, 'Yeah, because it seems like I can never do anything right around here.' So my father looked at me and said, 'We don't beat you because we hate you, we beat you because we love you.' So I said ok, but would you just mind not loving me so much. And of course, everybody at the table fell out laughing. For a couple of weeks, I didn't get into trouble."

URIAS was preceded in death by his parents Eddie and Odessa Beebe, and his siblings and in-laws, Eddie Grant (Margaret) Beebe, Juanita Stewart and Raymond (Helen) Beebe and nephew, Edwin L. Beebe.
