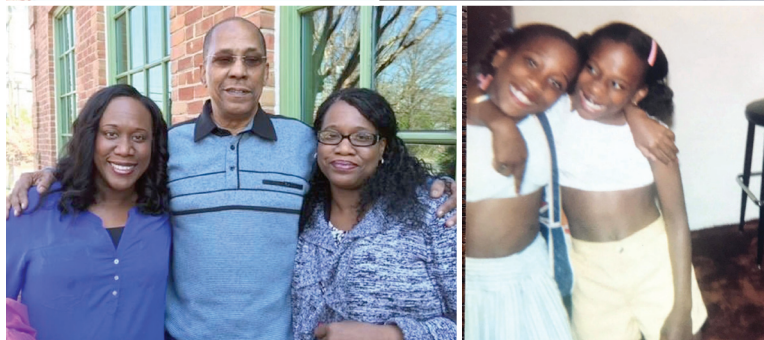
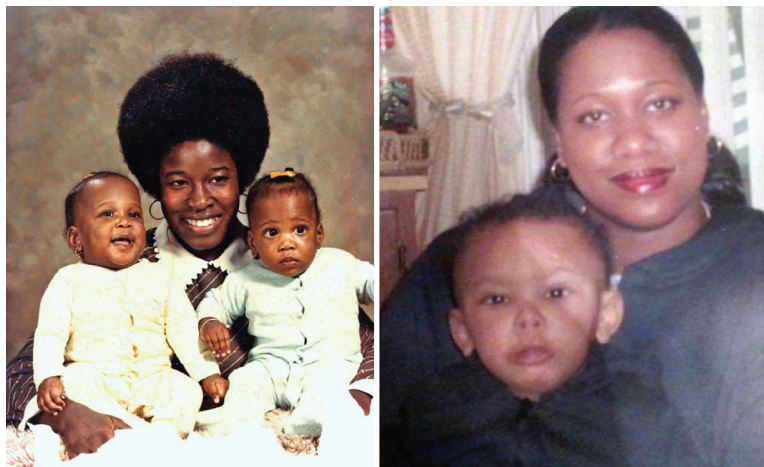

## Tracy's Life...

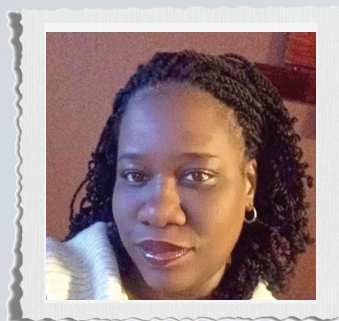
