JAMES WALTER WALL,

affectionally known by family as "Bud" and the community as "Po Boy," was born in Dillon County, SC on April 18, 1936. He attended Union High School. In 1963, he married his childhood friend, Ida Pearl Bethea, and they had three children.

An entrepreneur at heart, Bud ventured into various business opportunities. In 1967, he opened a pool room. In 1970, he transformed the pool room into a night club for teenagers. Back then, he sold canned sodas for 30 cents each and it was open every Saturday night from 11:00 to 12:30 p.m. He enjoyed mentoring young people.

Bud loved fishing and was very knowledgeable about seafood. He took an interest in cleaning fish and in 1973, he opened what became the renowned Po Boy's Seafood Market in Fayetteville, NC. He was well respected and adopted the name "Po Boy" from all of his loyal customers who frequented the market.

In 1975, Bud decided he wanted to build his own house. He completed the house that year and also took pride in later caring for farm animals to include mules, chickens, pigs, cows, dogs, cats, ducks and turtles. He enjoyed spending time with his grandchildren, playing the guitar for them, and was their biggest supporter in educational pursuits.

Preceding him in death was his father, James Walter Wall; mother, Leola Hayes Wall; sisters, Ardena Hayes Shaw and Evelyn Wall Jackson; brother, Clarence Hayes; and son, James Michael Wall.
