Together with the Lord.





THE LIFE OF Dr. Evangelist Mary Ann Gourdine Smith

APRIL 14, 1930 - APRIL 1, 2022



was a mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother who earned distinction as a religious scholar, a public servant, and most importantly, a steadfast servant of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

She was born in Pineville, SC to Robert "Doctor" Gourdine (deceased) and Emily "Sessie" Gadsden Gourdine (deceased). She was the fourth of eight children born to this union. Having received her primary education in the segregated schools of Berkeley County, South Carolina, Mary Ann learned early in life that a prime responsibility of every person was to strive to better their condition in life. Subsequent to bearing Emily Jeanne Gourdine (Jacksonville, Florida) she moved to New York City in 1949 where she worked as a housekeeper and nurse's assistant. She met and married the love of her life, Nathaniel Smith, Sr. and to that union three children were born: Dedra Simmons (Rudolph) - Greer, SC; Denise Smith Callaci (Anthony-deceased) - NY, NY; and Nathaniel Smith, Jr. (Jewel) - NY, NY. While residing in New York, her humanitarian efforts were constantly on display, for she left her home with her newborn and returned to South Carolina to care for her parentless nieces and nephews for eighteen months.

From her many challenging experiences, she continued to believe that education and hard work were the two most powerful strategies that a Black woman could use to better her conditions in an unjust society. She, therefore, obtained two academic degrees – a B.A. in Psychology (1986) from the College of New Rochelle and a Master of Science in Gerontology (1989) from the College of New Rochelle. In addition, she received two theological degrees – a Doctor of Sacred Letters Degree (1983) from Eastern American University and a Master of Bible Theology Degree (1986) from the International Bible Institute and Seminary.

In 1992, **EVANGELIST SMITH** and her husband, Nathaniel Smith, Sr. retired and took up residence in Fayetteville, NC with four grandchildren: Nicole Smith-Dayes - Statesville, NC, WO-1 Marcus J. "Daniel" Smith (Tamika) - Savannah, GA, John Mark Smith (deceased), and Tnijah "Toni" Smith - Orlando, FL. Her other two grandchildren are Rudy Simmons (Mindy) - Alabama and Shannon Simmons - Greenville, SC.

MARY ANN loved her siblings, in-laws, nieces and nephews to include her brother, Bishop William "Dempsey" Gourdine (deceased); brother, Robert Gourdine, Jr. (deceased); brother, Louise Edward Gourdine (deceased); sister, Ernestine Williams (deceased); sister, Lillian Brown (deceased); sister, Pauline Prioleau (deceased); sister, Inez Barksdale (deceased); brotherin-law, Henry Smith (deceased); sisters-in-law, Carrie Gourdine - Matthews, NC and Marian Gourdine - Rock Hill, SC.
