

## John's Life...

**OHN L. FELDER** of Fayetteville, North Carolina, went home to be with his Lord and Savior on November 3, 2022. He and wife, Pearl (deceased) were longtime members of the Division Memorial Chapel for over 30 years. He had faith and a strong belief in the Lord.

He honorably served in the United States Air Force for over 25 years, enlisting in 1951. After retirement, he worked at the Shearon Harris Nuclear Plant, then worked on Fort Bragg as a civil servant before final retirement. His last job was a facilitator for MWR on Fort Bragg. He received several commendations and medals, after being trained as a medic, even flying helicopters in order to rescue pilots during the Vietnam war.
