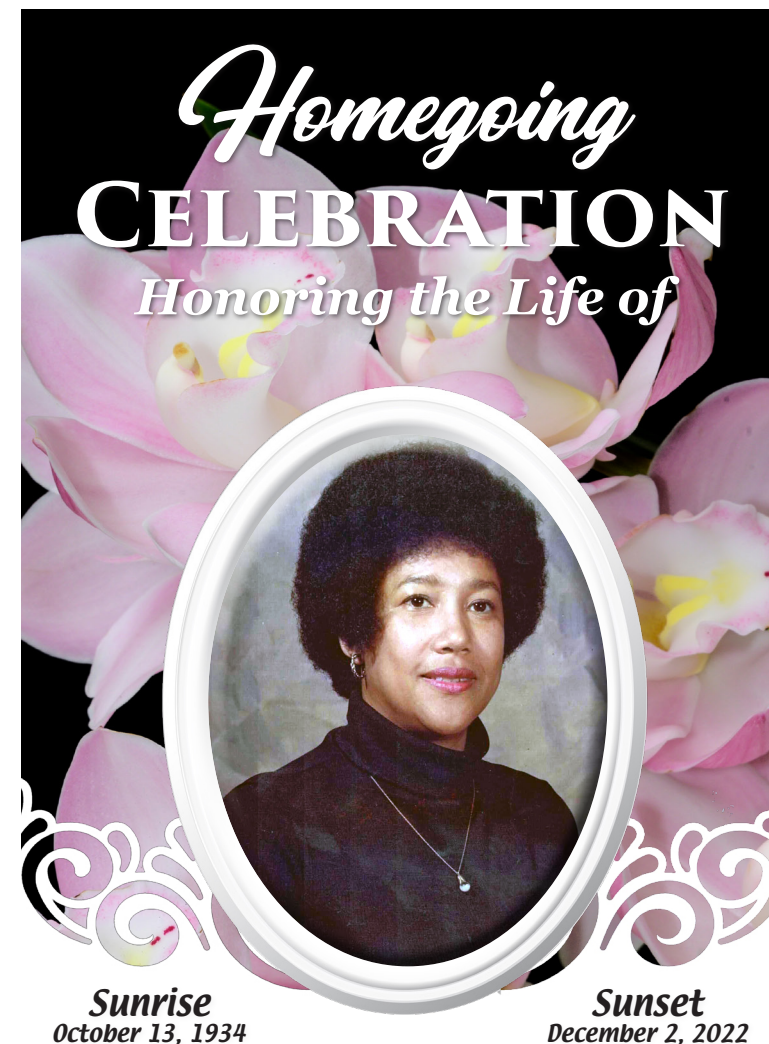

Alberta's Life...

MRS. ALBERTA BUSKEY, age 88, of Fayetteville, passed away Friday morning, December 02, 2022, at her residence.

She was born October 13, 1934, in Orangeburg, SC., a daughter of the late Ezekiel and Rosa Sistrunk.

ALBERTA was preceded in death by her husband of 65 years, Herbert L. Buskey; two brothers, James Sistrunk and Monroe Sistrunk; two sisters, Beulah Sistrunk and Rose Sistrunk Bradley.

ALBERTA attended and graduated from Wilkinson High School in Orangeburg, SC. After graduating from high school, she briefly relocated to New York City before moving to Fayetteville, NC, in 1954, where she married Herbert L. Buskey, the love of her life. Four children were born of this union.

She was an active member of the church, starting with Butler Chapel AME Church, as a child and ending as a devoted and faithful member of Lewis Chapel Missionary Baptist Church.
