Come home servant and get your reward.


We'll miss you always Dad

EDWARD "JUNIE" HENRY CHAVIS, JR. of Fayetteville, North Carolina, passed away Monday, December 19, 2022. He was born on December, 13, 1947 in Greensboro, North Carolina to Edward H. Chavis, Sr. and Bernice Peebles Chavis.

He grew up in Raleigh, NC where he worked on the family farm, worked at A&P, and drove a school bus until he graduated from West Cary High School in 1966. It was these experiences that led him to be a man of hard work and dedication. After high school, he attended North Carolina A&T State University where he received a Bachelor's Degree in Agricultural Economics in 1970. He then began working for the Grand Union Corporation in Paterson, New Jersey as the general manager.
