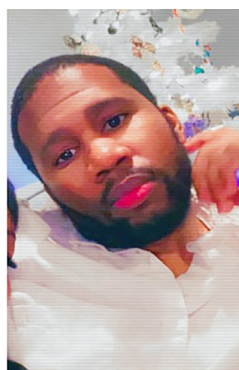


Message From Traci

take care of your own children as well. She always had to get the last word with her children. Traci said, “on Monday, October 9, 2023, she (Traci) became a full adult”. With her mother reminding her of things, it was only preparing her for a time such as this.
